Our efforts included resolving system access issues, managing user permissions, clarifying platform usage (e.g., OpenProject, Mautic), and addressing real-time technical challenges. Support patterns continue to be monitored to inform long-term improvements to our helpdesk systems.

Three: DevOps & System Maintenance

Notes: As part of our routine responsibilities, we maintained a consistent focus on system reliability and infrastructure health. This included ongoing DevOps work such as scheduled



maintenance, uptime monitoring, and the management of automated backup processes to ensure data integrity across all deployed tools.

Four: Community Task Board (Ongoing Work)

Notes: Development is underway for the Community Task Board, a new workflow within OpenProject that enables Circle Coordinators to post tasks accessible to any vetted community member. Ultimately, the goal is to not only improve execution but also to identify and engage top talent for long-term involvement in the ecosystem.

- Having it as a specific role could help someone in each Circle transition from entry-level tasks to more responsibility.

In line with this, we have started contacting Circle Coordinators to ask them what they think about role descriptions.
