One: Marketing Bot Deployment: Milestone

Notes: We deployed the first marketing bot to production to support targeted outreach and engagement. Remaining bots are still under active development with feature parity, consent flow hardening, and operator runbooks planned.

Two: DevOps & Support Maintenance: Event

Notes: We continued routine platform upkeep—security updates, patching, SSL renewals, monitoring/alert tuning—and provided responsive support across circles. Uptime remained high with minimal disruptions. Q4 maintenance windows and expanded incident runbooks are being prepared to further strengthen reliability.

Three: OpenProject Bug Fixes & Stability: Event

Notes: Fixes focused on the Mattermost–OpenProject integration layer. We improved slash-command handling and webhook routing, resolved payload parsing edge cases, and tightened permission checks to prevent misrouted tasks. These changes stabilized the centralized intake \rightarrow auto-assignment flow triggered from Mattermost, reducing failures and speeding responses.

Four: BigQuery Data Platform & Pipelines: New Initiative New Insight

Notes: We initiated the build of a BigQuery warehouse and ingestion pipelines spanning multiple data sources. Work included defining domain schemas, setting up source connectors/ETL, and establishing normalization rules and data contracts to unify IDs and timestamps across sources. Upcoming work focuses on staging datasets per source, scheduled loads (daily/near-real-time), basic data quality checks, and a lightweight data catalog (tables, owners, refresh cadence).

1) Feeling It! - Images about DF: New Initiative

Notes: We created https://padlet.com/onboardingcircle/feeling-it-rte5o00l0lieff5z, the "Feeling it!" game on Padlet, inviting people to create an image to describe how they feel about DF. The aim was to have a break from the often very verbal approach that our community has, and try a more visual approach - but also to give people a chance to raise problems in a different way.

In the All-Circles meeting on 8th October we had a lively and interesting discussion in breakout rooms about the images that had been submitted, despite a slightly wobbly start where not everyone realised that the images were about DF $\stackrel{.}{.}$ It also raised the wider question of whether small breakout rooms help to combat the problem of people not speaking in meetings, which has since become the topic of a Mattermost poll.

We plan to have one more "image-discussion" session like this, at the next All-Circles on 5th Nov; then we'll move to looking at what issues people were raising, and how we might progress those. We might also repeat the activity with another round of image submission in the future - maybe next Quarter?

2) Ethics and principles of DF: Discussion

Notes: In our October meetings, we have been discussing what the core principles and ethics of DF are, with a view to being able to explain them to newly onboarded people, both Circles members and new proposers. We note that when a person comes into a new community, understanding what the community's core beliefs are is often a really important part of feeling onboarded.

We've explored how we think these principles are enacted in practice - what do we do as the DF community, and as individual Circles, to shore them up and support them? We've also wondered - how fixed are these principles, and what degree of divergence is OK? What should we be telling new people about which issues we all agree on, and which ones there is a range of opinion about?

As it's a complex discussion, we haven't yet got something to share about all this but we want to hear from other Circles on it. We plan to bring something to an All-Circles meeting, or share a doc for comments, or perhaps bring something to Loomio, next month.

3) Entry-level tasks and onboarding new people: New Insight

Notes: Last month, we were working on the recruitment process by looking at the targeted recruitment questions that each Circle might want to use in the recruitment form. This month, we've been looking at the next stage in the recruitment process: entry-level tasks for new Circle members.

We have collected input from all the Circles about what makes a good entry-level task and how they manage these; and we have connected this with the ideas we worked on previously about how Circles can use either bounty tasks or a trial period in their recruitment, as an alternative or an adjunct to interviewing applicants. We'll have some guidance and ideas ready to share with Circles in a couple of weeks, drawn from the input we have gathered from everyone.

4) Onboarding flows: New Initiative

Notes: We have begun looking at the flow, or process, of new people coming into DF - whether to Circles, or as proposers and voters. Where do people come in from; and once in, how do they progress? A lot of this crosses over with questions of where the invitation is shared, and who sees it; so we see it as connected with Marketing; and it also crosses over with Data Analytics to examine whether people are experiencing a smooth flow, or finding blockers.

This is quite new work, so we will have more to report on it next month - but initially, with the help of Cardoso from the Events Circle, we are looking at the community hubs and trying to map out where people come into these from, how they progress once they are there, and trying to identify any needs for onboarding resources.

1. Social Media Performance Review - August Insights: New Insight Decision

Milestone *

Objective: Analyze September's performance across LinkedIn, YouTube, Twitter, and Telegram.

Type: Recurrent.

Stakeholders: Marketing circle.

Output: Highlight which posts drove the most engagement, when activity peaked, and what fell flat. Create clear, actionable recommendations on what to post, how often, and at what times, giving the team a practical roadmap for the coming month, next quarter, and year ahead.

Next steps: Standardize the report and have a pipeline to automate data ingestion.

2. Open Project Survey: Event New Insight Milestone

Objective: Assess OpenProject implementation success by comparing user experience metrics across a 4.5-month period to quantify improvements and identify success drivers.

Type: ADHOC.

Stakeholders: Operations circle.

Output: Overall Satisfaction, Impact Perception, Ease of Use, Training Coverage Active Usage were measured with a positive difference between the two waves of data collection. Analysis confirms successful implementation and localizes areas of improvement in the DF workforce.

Next steps: Identify target goals and propose standard training (template) to onboard new people.

3. Feedback systems: Milestone New Insight New Initiative

Objective: Map out all the types of experiences listed (tools, tasks, community, events, onboarding, reporting, external representation).

Type: Recurrent.

Stakeholders: Events circle.

Output: Develop an effective engagement strategy for feedback systems in DeepFunding. This should help boost active participation, constructive feedback and continuous improvement.

Next steps: Storytelling and communicating results.

4. Voting Simulation | LLM Comparison: Event New Insight Challenge Milestone

Objective: Evaluate how closely different ranking methods (simulations) align with the real ranking of projects within the BGI Round. The goal is to develop an appropriate filter for proposals' selection.

Type: ADHOC.

Stakeholders: Review Circle.



Output: Comparison of alternative voting methods using three complementary evaluation criteria: MARE, which captures the average positional error relative to the real ranking; Spearman's rho, which measures the strength of monotonic agreement; and Kendall's tau, which focuses on pairwise concordance. Results also showcase trade-offs between algorithms.

Next steps: LLM Usage in pair-wise voting (anonymizing the data beforehand).

5. Documentation and Standardization: Event Decision Challenge

New Initiative

Objective: Document projects, collaborate / version code using Github, create report templates and have a data infrastructure ready to keep data in motion.

Type: Recurring.

Stakeholders: Analytics Circle.

Output: Open Project, Github, peer-review work sessions (listing managed objects), Add everything to shared drive. Build CI/CD pipelines. Single Source of Truth: build internal credibility with descriptive statistics, serving the circles

Next steps: Create pull-requests rules.

One: Review circle meeting restructuring: New Initiative Upgrade Process

Notes: The Review Circle meeting on 15th October 2025 focused on improving processes and engagement. Members discussed shifting to a bi-weekly meeting schedule to boost participation.

Two: CRISP/Pre-CRISP: New Insight New Process

Notes: The CRISP and Pre-CRISP collaboration continues to evolve to strengthen the ideation and proposal review pipeline. Discussions focused on refining structural alignment between both stages, improving clarity around roles, and ensuring smoother transition from idea generation to more concrete outcomes such as RFPs, MVPs (LABS)...etc.

Three: Milestone Recovery Path (MRP)

Label: New Initiative Challenge New Process

Description: The Milestone Recovery Path (MRP) is a new process developed within the Review Circle to manage unfinished or unachievable milestones in Deep Funding projects. It provides a structured and transparent path for teams to correct issues, resubmit deliverables, and undergo re-evaluation before contract termination. By combining accountability with support, the MRP helps prevent project abandonment, protects community funds, and encourages constructive collaboration between

reviewers and builders. Its implementation strengthens fairness, consistency, and trust in the Deep Funding governance process while generating insights to continuously improve milestone evaluation standards.

One: Townhal Update: New Initiative Challenge Decision New Insight

Notes: We are updating the Target audience for our Townhall. As such, we are preparing for this 6 month revision, and creating the full process for revision of the performance of the Hubs. The goal for this process is to evaluate the general performance (monthly and overall) and establish the next steps.

Four: Future Development Community Hubs: Milestone New Initiative

Notes: As part of the revision process, we need to define what are the next steps are for the Hubs, and how we can make sure that hubs that are doing good work, have the chance to grow and do even more.

As such, we started working on a framework for the future steps and development of the successful Hubs, as well as what should happen to the remaining Hubs, depending on their level of performance.

We also need to understand from the Hubs what are their plans and ideas are for the next months.

One: Campus Tour Started in Nigeria: New Initiative

Notes: We have started in earnest the first of its kind Campus tournament to be a quick onboarding structure for developers and students alike. In the first of its kind, we had about 30+ student who registered, as evident on the backend of the Mautic platform, where all their registrations go to. All the devs will be followed up with regular content on hackathons, RFPS, ideation challenges etc in deepfunding.

Two: Campus Tour in India and Ghana to Follow: Event

Notes: India and Ghana are actively planning to start their process for their campus tour process already. While MIT is on hold due to campus activities, we are exploring GHRCE and a host of other universities. In Ghana, momentum is equally building, and in partnership with some members of the event circle and other Circles, we are locking in dates already for this.

Three: 6 Physical Hackathons in Nigeria: Event

Notes: The initial idea is to use Nigeria as a pilot to what we may be doing all through Africa and globally. As such, we are having 6 regional hackathons in Nigeria and a National hackathon. Winners of the regions will advance to the national hackathon, which will be held in Lagos, Nigeria. So far in less than 1 week of announcing the

hackathon, more than 66 applications have come in. We also used a gender balanced approach as we mandated that each team must mandatorily have a female participant.

One: Continued Progress on MkDocs Automation: Milestone
